SECTION B

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the Institution

During this academic year new initiatives were implemented in the campus to attain the broad objectives of empowerment and education. The programmes implemented include,

Walk With Scholar: Arranged specialized mentoring programmes in undergraduate levels

Scholar Support Programme: For imparting additional support in curricular areas of weakness.

Equal Opportunity Cell: Provided suitable environment for the students with special needs and those from deprived backgrounds. In addition the HEPSN cell was also organized different programmes to empower persons with special needs

Coaching for entry in to Services: Students were given ample opportunity for getting equipped for facing examinations for carrier selection. These were introduced along with the regular teaching learning and evaluation activities implemented through time tables, tutorial programmes and internal as well as external examinations.

Consultancy and Extension Services: The consultancy and extension services provided by different disciplines of the college gives the opportunity of utilization of the resources available to the public.

- 2. New academic programmes initiated: Department of Physics was recognized as a new research Centre under university of Calicut. Proposals had already been submitted for BSc Computer Science programme in undergraduate level. Department of Malayalam contributed an add-on course in DTP.
- **3.** Innovations in curricular design and transaction : Since new curriculum were introduced in the academic year 2009-2010 for all 13 under graduate programmes there were no new initiations in this regard during this academic year. Dr. P. Rajendran and Dr. K. Padmakumar of Chemistry department, Dr. C .V. Sreeranjith kumar of Zoology department and Dr. K E Job and A K Amala of Commerce department have served as UG board of studies members of University of Calicut. Prof. M. P. Sethumadhavn of Zoology department served as UG board of studies chairman and PG board member.
- 4. Inter disciplinary programmes started: Almost all of the currently running inter-departmental collaborative programmes are curriculum based. 46 different programmes undertaken by faculty of different disciplines are complementary in nature along with 14 different open programmes.
- **5.** Examination reforms implemented: Currently following examination systems for UG and PG is being followed on a semester basis. In addition to the semester examinations conducted by the university, for continuous internal evaluation, two internal tests along with assignments and seminars are given in each subject in all the disciplines.
- **6. Candidates qualified NET/SLET/GATE etc.:** During this academic year 27 students from different disciplines got qualified in the NET/SET/GATE examinations. In addition, 55 students after completing education got admitted to institutions of National importance.

7. Initiative towards faculty development programme: Organized a teacher training workshop on 'Nature Awareness' with financial assistance from WWF – Kerala Chapter.

11. New collaborative research programmes : Nil

12. Research grants received from various agencies: During this academic year, Rupees six lakh was received by Physics department and rupees two lakh was received by department of English from UGC as major and minor research project grants.

13. Details of research scholars: No candidates were registered for PhD during this academic year. However, there was one project fellow in department of Physics and one in department of Zoology.

14. Citation index of faculty members and impact factor: 30 research papers were published by the faculty members during this year. Among them, 15 were published in international peer reviewed journals and another 15 in national peer reviewed journals. Average impact factor of the papers reported during this year is 1.55.

Four books were published by faculty members of this college during this academic year; two from Tamil department and one from History and one from Economics department.

15. Honors/awards to the faculty: Two faculty members (One each from History and Botany departments) were awarded PhD.

16. Internal resources generated : Major contribution of the internal resources available for the routine activities of the institution is from PTA funds along with a minor contribution from CDC. As the institution is run by government, the avenues for internal fund generation is limited.

17. Details of Departments getting assistance/recognition under SAP, COSIST (ASSIST)/DST, FIST and other programmes : Department of Chemistry is getting assistance under the FIST scheme.

18. Community services: Two different units of NSS are actively involved in community programmes. 10 different programmes were undertaken by NSS including

planting of seedlings, campus cleaning, blood donation camp etc. In addition blood group detection camps were also organized by NSS.

Calicut University has prescribed 42 days of compulsory social service (CSS) a prerequisite for awarding bachelor degrees from 2000 onwards. The students of this college has actively involved in the social activities of local bodies, education institutions, voluntary organisations, NGOs and Government agencies as part of their CSS programme.

21. Improvements in the library services: Library facilities are available to all students irrespective of time. Total number of books available in library is 1,18,915 out of which 2656 new books were added during this academic year. In addition to the general library, departmental libraries are operating with specialized sections in each subject.

22. New Books/Journals subscribed and their values: During this academic year, 2656 books were added to the library facilities. In addition, 28 journals were subscribed.

23. Courses in which student assessment of teachers is introduced and the action taken on student feedback: Student feedback on courses as well as assessment of teachers were undertaken in all undergraduate and post-graduate programmes. The data being analyzed by IQAC and individual faculty members were intimated of their strong and weak points so that they could improve their performance in the forthcoming academic year.

24. Feedback from stakeholders

Necessary steps were undertaken by IQAC to improve the performance of the institution based upon the periodical feedback from the old faculty members and alumni.

26. Computerization of administration and the process of admissions and examination results, issue of certificates

Administration section had been computerized previously and institute maintained this process during this year also. Office automation process is completed during this year. Calicut university introduced online registration process for various programmes in this year. Student admission and registration process were done online. Students were instructed to apply and register for examinations online. Social groups and strata which are disadvantaged in terms of caste, gender, class, region and religion are given reservation in admission. Comprehensive and updated prospectus is issued along with application form. The College website (<u>www.victoriacollege</u>.in) publishes every detail related to admission and queries are answered forthwith, in consultation with the committee constituted to oversee the admission process. Announcement regarding the general admission process and extension of dates, wherever necessary, is published in regional newspapers. Information regarding the admission process is published on the College notice board and updates can be had from the section during working hours.

Examination results are announced by the university and the mark lists issued by university is distributed by the administration division.

27. Increase in the infra -structural facilities

- Smart class rooms are introduced at all teaching departments during this year
- College installed two interactive white boards
- A new seminar hall (O V Vijayan hall) was set at Malayalam department
- Wash basin facility is introduced in the ground floor of Malayalam department

28. Technology upgradation: a. Continued ICT enabled teaching in appropriate areas of teaching.

b. Edusat Programme: College has telecasted 21 live classes on various discipline during this academic year. Additionally, 2 video conferences were arranged in the college during this period.

c. SPARK salary system: Online salary bill preparation through SPARK system introduced by Kerala Government, is implemented in the campus. Employees of this institute are encouraged to prepare their salary bills through this system.

29. Computer and internet access and training to teachers, non- teaching staff and students: Computer facility with internet connection is available centrally for the use of staffs and students. Additionally, there are many computer labs with internet connection associated with various departments of this college. Majority of the staff are familiar with computer and internet usages. Training is given to students by a dedicated computer engineer appointed by the PTA of this college.

30. Financial aid to students: Eighty seven students were given financial support of total Rs. 1, 89,000/- under different schemes. All the avenues for financial support for students are monitored by the administrative system from time to time.

31. Activities and support from the Alumni association: This college receives financial and other support from its alumni members regularly. The OSA of Govt. Victoria undertakes many activities in the campus for the upliftment of students. OSA has given a financial support of Rs.50,000/- to meet the expenses of students in connection with zonal arts festivals. In addition, Alumni and OSA offers many scholarships and endowments to the students.

32. Activities and support from the Parent – Teacher association: PTA undertakes many of the developmental activities of this institution. This year PTA contributed six lakh rupees for different activities of the college.

33. Health Services: Healthcare centre at students amenity centre is accessible to all students and staffs of this college to meet their immediate medical requirements.

34. Performance in sports activities: The Dept. of Physical education is providing facilities for more no of physical training programmes, such as A class cricket field, fields for hockey, football and track & field events, etc. To promote Indoor Sports & Games the Dept. of Physical education offer Gymnasium, Weight Training Hall, health Club, halls for Table Tennis & Yoga etc. In addition the Dept. of Physical education has Basket Ball, Volley Ball, Ball Badminton, Kabaddi & Kho-Kho courts. Five students participated in national level sports competitions and 8 students in state level events and 52 students in university level sports and games events during this year. Department of physical education conducted 12 different sports and games events during this year.

a. Higher Education for Persons with Special Needs (HEPSN)

HEPSN cell is introduced in this year and 3 programmes were organized which benefitted about 105 students of this college

b. Equal opportunity cell

Equal Opportunity Cell is introduced this year to provide a suitable enabling environment to all students with special needs and those from deprived backgrounds direction. A vast majority of this college students are from minority, SC/ST background, and from economically poor conditions. All these students are entitled to services offered by the Equal Opportunity Cell. The cell has organized various programmes for students who need extra help with their course work.

c. Walk With a Scholar (WWS)

Scheme proposes to arrange specialized mentoring programs for students in Under Graduate Programs in Arts, Science and Commerce and to provide guidance for their future. The scheme introduces the idea of mentoring and builds on the concept of mentor as a 'Guide' and 'Friend'.

The Scheme aims at giving necessary orientation to needy students, to prepare them for employment and give them necessary guidance, motivation and mental support to identify appropriate areas for higher study as well as employment. The programme is structured in such a way to identify the opportunities available for the scholars, the areas suitable for them, the manner in which the scholar should proceed before them and evolve ways by which they can be acquired.

d. Scholar Support Programme (SSP)

The Scholar Support Programme, part of the 'New Initiatives in Higher Education' initiated by the Department of Higher Education, Govt. Of Kerala aims at imparting additional support to students in curricular areas of weakness. The pilot phase of the programme is initiated in the college in the current academic year. In this programme, additional curricular support has been offered to first semester degree students.

e. Entry into Service

Entry into service cell regularly conducts coaching classes for students of this college. This year we conducted 11 coaching classes in which 67 students attended.
