## SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME

### REPORT ON - 2015-16

As per the circular from the Director of Collegiate Education, the Principal on the recommendation of the College Council appointed MANIKANDAN K, Assistant Professor of Economics as the Coordinator of the SSP 2015-16.

#### **Classes**

As per the result analysis published by the Department of Collegiate Education and discussion there on in the College Council, the college selected the following DEPARTMENTS for the Programme during the academic year.

#### **I/II Semester**

1. General English
2. B.com Honours
3. Chemistry (complementary)
4. Mathematics (complementary)
5. Sanskrit Complementary

#### **III/IV semester**

1. General English
2. Chemistry
3. History (complementary)
4. Mathematics
5. Commerce

## **V/VI Semester**

1. Economics
2. Chemistry
3. Commerce
4. History
5. Hindi

Students for the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> semester classes were selected by giving preference to those who were already there in the programme and intended to continue. New students were allowed to enroll instead of those who are not ready to be regular in the class. New students for 1<sup>st</sup> semester were selected on the basis of the recommendations on the basis of College Council decision. Difficult subjects were taken on the basis of past result analysis while selecting students for SSP.

## **Distribution of Study Materials**

Study materials were distributed both in terms of Photo copies of Text books/reference materials suggested by the teachers taking SSP classes and in the form of printed study materials. An amount of Rs. 24000/- (Rupees Twenty Four thousand only) was spent for the distribution of printed study materials to the students during this academic year. This amount was spent for the printing of questions banks supplied by the programme manager and study materials prepared by the teachers. It was very helpful to them to prepare for university examinations.

## **Fund Utilization**

Total allotment for the programme for this year is Rs. 186500/-. Total expenditure for the programme is also Rs. 186500/-. Out of this, Rs. 130000/- spent for remuneration to the

members of faculty, Rs24000/-- for study materials (20000+ 4000 balance adjusted from the travelling expense amount), Rs. 3000/- for office stationery and printing, Rs10000/-for providing light refreshment to students present, 3000 for meeting travelling expenses of the students, Rs 4500/- for providing stationery kit to students and Rs. 12000/- to the coordinator as remuneration. Because of the impracticable rules, amount allotted for TA to students is also not spent. These amounts were used to provide study materials to students. The rate of fund utilization is 100%.

## **Attendance of Students**

Attendance of the students in the programme is better. Most of the students availed the benefit. Attendance of all courses is high except for a few courses.

## **Achievements of the Programme**

The programme gave opportunity to the weaker students to improve their study. High percent of attendance in classes indicates the need of students for remedial classes. The study materials, text books and question banks distributed to the students were very helpful to improve their academic performance. Timely allotment of fund helped for the early starting of the classes. There were full hearted co-operation from the faculty members as well as students for the timely completion of the programme.

## **Limitations of the Programme**

During the busy schedule of the CCSS, it was very difficult to conduct the courses on the basis of predetermined schedule. It compelled to reschedule the classes on the basis of the convenience of the students and teachers. Uniform time schedule was not possible because of the difficulty of the students to attend the programme. Many students suggested conducting the classes during 3.30-4.30 pm on working days. However, this time schedule was not appropriate for some other students. Delay in university examinations especially those of first semester classes created another difficulty on the smooth conduct of the programme.

## **Suggestions to Improve the Programme**

- 1) Timely allotment of fund is needed. Delay in releasing fund caused for shortage of time to work efficiently during the tight semester schedules.
- 2) There shall be flexibility in the number of students and the number of courses subject to the limitation of maximum number of hours and allotment.
- 3) Workshop for the preparation of questions banks shall be organized at the University level.
