This year the motivational visit was arranged to Bangalore and Mysore during 16-21 February, 2016. The first visit was to **Indian Institute of Management** Bangalore (IIMB), a prestigious institute for management studies. The IIM Faculty members introduced to the students about different programmes, selection procedures, placement status of previous years, etc. The ambiance of the campus itself inspired the mentees who are looking ahead for their further studies in management sector. After that we visited the **Bannerghatta National Park and Biological Park** with rare species of animals and birds. In the second day we visited **Visvesvaraya Industrial and Technological Museum** (VIT Museum) established under National Council of Science Museums, Ministry of Culture, Government of India. In VIT Museum students got a chance to see the working models based on the different basic concepts in science. They were also given a chance to work with these models and this helped them to understand the scientific principles and concepts. The next day we visited **CSIR-Central Food Technological Research Institute**, Mysore (CSIR-CFTRI), set up under the aegis of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research. (CSIR). The researchers and scientists explained to the students about the various activities of CSIR-CFTRI, technologies developed in food preservation, and how these technologies can be extended to the farmers, various analytical techniques to ensure the quality of food, technologies for spices extraction, career opportunities in food technology and research, etc. The visit encouraged students to take up higher studies and research in this new area. Then we visited the Mysore Palace known for its historical significance. This gave a historical insight of ancient India. Next we visited **Shuka Vana (Parrot Park)**, the largest one in India with a huge collection of rare colourful species of parrots brought from different parts of the globe. This years' motivational visit came to an end with a visit to **Brindavana Gardens**.

Fifteen faculty members were selected as the internal mentors and each one of them were given a team of six mentees. The details are given below. They conducted various internal mentoring sessions to their wards. The small group size of students (six members) helped the Mentors to give individual attention and care to each student.
